1. Affiliation of the school CBSE & Two Shift Permission

Every challenge has been an opportunity for growth, and every achievement a step toward excellence.

We are proud to share that in November 2024, Sree Narayana Guru Central School received affiliation from the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE).

Additionally, we are pleased to inform you that we have obtained permission from CBSE to operate in two shifts. We also have prior approval from the Maharashtra Education Department to conduct classes in two shifts.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the Management of SNMS and to all parents for their unwavering support and encouragement throughout this journey.

2. Independence Day & Republic Day & Gandhi Jayanti

We celebrated both the 76th Republic Day on January 26th 2025 and 79th Independence Day on August 15, 2025, with immense enthusiasm and patriotic fervor.

Gandhi Jayanti was celebrated on 1st October 2025 .The celebrations encouraged children to embody Gandhian values in daily life.

3. Kargil Vijay Diwas

CBSE ACTIVITIES & COMPETITIONS

11. Film Screening and Honouring the Safai Karmacharis

As an initiative by the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education, Government of India, a special screening of the film *Chalo Jeete Hain*, which was awarded Best Non-Feature Film on Family Values at the 66th National Film Awards, was held on 27th September. The aim of this screening was to encourage young learners to reflect on important values such as character, service, responsibility, empathy, and moral reasoning. Following the screening, the secondary students honored the Safai Karmacharis of our school by presenting each of them with an amount of Rs. 200, collected from the sale of Rakhis made by students during the open house.

12. Heritage Quiz

Our students participated in the Heritage Quiz conducted by CBSE on 13th November 2025, to promote awareness and appreciation of India's rich cultural heritage among school students.. The 3 participants were Himalaya Chaplot, Angel Solanki and Asmi Rodi of std IX

13. Science Exhibition

In addition, to foster curiosity and develop a scientific attitude among learners, CBSE organized a Science Exhibition. The theme was STEM for Vikisit Bharat, with sub-themes Health and Hygiene and Emerging Technologies. It was held on 13th & 14th November

2025, at DPS Nerul.

Participants from our school in the two categories are as follows:

14. Aryabhata Ganit Challenge

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) organized the Aryabhata Ganit Challenge (AGC) to promote practical mathematical skills among students. The competition was held in two stages: the School-Level Competition and the National Level. In the school-level round which was held between 7th & 10th October all students of std VIII and IX participated, and the top three students were selected for the national level, which was held online on 29th October 2025. Laksh Anand (IX B), Aditya Patel (IX B), and Parth Jadhav (IX A) participated in the event. The results are currently awaited.

15. Poshan Pakhwada

As part of the Poshan Abhiyan (National Nutrition Mission), the Government of India to raise awareness about nutrition, promote healthy lifestyles, and combat childhood obesity, particularly among school children, Sree Narayana Guru Central Schools encouraged the promotion of traditional and local foods, such as Shree Anna (millets), through knowledge-sharing sessions that highlight their nutritional benefits and support indigenous agricultural practices for better health. It was celebrated on 19th April 2025.

16. Bagless Day

CBSE has issued guidelines for Bagless Days, promoting hands-on, interactive, and creative activities to reduce students' burden of carrying bags, in line with NEP 2020. In response, SNGCS organized activities like a visit to SNG Bank, kite making, and doodling to enhance learning, creativity, and practical skills. The activities were held on 22nd September and 8th October 2025.

Additionally, on 8th October 2025, an UPSC Awareness Program was conducted to introduce students to Civil Services, inspire career ambitions, and emphasize the importance of national service and good governance. One of our parents, Mr Atul Kumar, guided the students on the same, who was a UPSC aspirant in the year 2014.

17. Sweet Moments, Less Sugar – Building Healthy Habits Together

The National Commission for Protection of Child Rights has highlighted a concerning rise in Type 2 diabetes among children, once predominantly an adult condition. As part of our commitment, SNGCS has already displayed a sugar board and adopted the tagline: "A step away from sugar, a step towards health" in all circulars, promoting awareness and healthier choices among students.

As a part of Nature Club activities, the following activities were conducted:

18. Earth Day Celebration – (Nursery to Grade IX)

20. Donation Drive

As part of the Eco Club's activities under the Mission Life initiative launched by the Ministry of Education, a Donation Drive was held on Monday, 28th April 2025. This initiative aimed to instill values of environmental responsibility and compassion among our students while supporting those in need. Students participated actively by donating used clothes and toys.

21. Other Activities (Nature Club)

Various initiatives were conducted to sensitize students about sustainable living and the importance of preserving nature. These included Plantation Drive, Tree QR Code Generation, the School Nutrition Garden project, Nature Walks, and the Adopt Food System program.

22. Pre-Primary Competitions

Various competitions were conducted in Balvatika, including Fancy Dress, Show and Tell, Hands-on Coloring, etc., to develop the children's gross motor skills, creativity, and to boost their imagination.

23. Primary & Secondary Competitions

In the Primary and Secondary sections, various competitions such as Slogan Writing, Drawing, Quiz, Paper Bag Making, Rangoli Making, Greeting Card Making, Thali Making, Hindi Recitation, Independence Day Speech, Marathi Elocution, and Poster Making were organized .

We also conducted skill activities such as Mukut making, clay moulding, Memory Quiz, debates and painting.

24. Excursions & Picnics

Balvatika enjoyed a fun-filled picnic at Bacha Party, Matunga.

The Primary section went on an educational excursion to the Science Centre.

The Secondary section visited Fountain city Water Park for a recreational outing, while Grade IX students embarked on an academic excursion to the Training Ship Rahaman, a premier marine educational training institution.

These were held in September 2025.

25. Parent Orientation Program

To establish effective communication and a strong partnership between parents and the school, we conducted Parent Orientation Program between 7th & 12 th April 2025

26. Extra Curricular activities

27. Annual Sports Day

28. House Points

At SNGCS School, this year onwards we are carefully recording and counting to identify the leading house, helping to promote healthy competition among students and build strong

team spirit within each house. Based on the accumulated points, in the AY 2025-26 , Blue House is emerging as the leading house with **209 points**, followed by Red House with **176 points**, Green House with **116 points**, and Yellow House with **89 points**.

29. School Council Election

The Student Council Election for 2025–26 was held on 16th April 2025 for students of Grades 6 to 9, promoting leadership and democratic values. The newly elected council is led by Asmi Rodi as President, Mikesh as Prime Minister, and other members who will represent their peers and actively contribute to school activities.

The four house captains and vice captains of the school are displayed on the screen.

They also advised students to be cautious of strangers or friends offering drugs, emphasizing the need to stay alert and seek help if needed.

33. PROJECT CACA

Under Project CACA (Children Against Child Abuse), a rights-based initiative, various important topics were discussed monthly to promote awareness and empowerment among children..

a. Nosebleed Awareness (Essence of Summer):

Children were introduced to the causes of nosebleeds and preventive measures.

b. Cyber Safety:

Students were educated on potential online threats. The session focused on safeguarding personal information, understanding cyber hygiene, learning about the IT Act, identifying fake news, and recognizing cyberbullying. This helped students develop responsible digital habits.

c. Time Management:

Students were introduced to effective time management techniques to help them plan and organize their schedules better to reduce stress, improve focus, and boost productivity.

d. Mental Wellbeing:

This initiative aimed to foster resilience and emotional well-being among students
