NATIONAL SYMBOLS

National Flag:

NATIONAL flag is a horizontal tricolour of deep saffron (Kesari) at the top, white in the middle and dark green at the bottom in equal proportion. Ratio of the width of the flag to its length is two to three. In the centre on the white band is a navy blue wheel which represents the Charkha. Its design is that of a wheel which appears on the abacus of the Sarnath Lion Capital of Ashoka. Its diameter approximates to the width of the white band and it has 24 spokes.

Design of the national flag was adopted by the Constituent Assembly of India on 22nd July, 1947. Its use and display are regulated by code.

State Emblem:

State emblem is an adaptation from Sarnzath Lion Capital of Ashoka. In the original, there are four lions, standing back to back, mounted on an abacus with a frieze carrying sculptures in high relief of an elephant, a galloping horse, a bull and a lion separated by intervening wheels over a bell-shaped lotus. Carved out of a single block of polished stones, the capital is crowned by the Wheel of the Lawn (Dharma Charkha).

In the state emblem adopted by the Government of India on 26th January 1950, only three lions are visible, the fourth being hidden from view. The wheels appears in relief in the centre of the abacus with a bull on right and a horse on left and the outlines of other wheels on extreme right and left. The bell-shaped lotus has been omitted. The words Satyameva Jayate from Mundaka Upanishad, meaning 'Truth Alone Triumphs' are inscribed below the abacus in the Devanagari script.

National Calendar:

National Calendar based on the Saka Era with Chaitra as its first month and a normal year of 365 days was adopted from 22nd March 1957 along with Gregorian for the following official purposes (i) Gazette of India, (ii) news broad casting by All India Radio,(iii) calendar issued by the Government of India and (iv) Government communications addressed to the members of public.

Dates of the national calendar have a permanent correspondence with dates of Gregorian calendar: I Chaitra falling on 22nd March normally and 21st March in leap year.

National Anthem:

The song Jana-gana-mana, composed by Rabindranath Tagore was adopted by the Constituent Assembly as the National Anthem of India on 24th January 1950. It was first sung on 27th December 1911 at the Calcutta Session of the Indian National Congress. The complete song consists of five stanzas. It reads:

Jana-gana-mana-adhinayak, jaya he Bharata-bhagya-vidhata

Punjab-Sindhu-Gujarat-Maratha Dravida-Utkala-Banga

Vindhya-Himachala-Yamuna-Ganga Uchchala-Jaladhi-taranga Tavashubha name jage, Tavashubhaasisa mange,

Gahetavajayagatha, Jana-gana-mangala-adhinayak, jaya he Bharata-bhagya-vidhata.

Playing time of the full version of the National Anthem is approximately 52 seconds. A short version consisting of first and last line of the stanza (playing time approximately 20 seconds) is also played on certain occasions. The following is Tagore's English rendering:

Thou art ruler of minds of all people, Thou dispenser of India's destiny.

Thy name rouses the hearts of Punjab, Sind

Gujarat and Maratha
Of the Dravid and Orissa and Bengal;

It echoes in the hills of the Vindhyas and Himalayas,

Mingles in the music of Jamuna and Ganges and is

Chanted by the waves of the Indian Sea.

They pray for thy blessings and sing thy praise.

The saving of all people waits in thy hand, Thou dispenser of India's destiny.

Victory, victory, victory to thee.

National Song:

The song VandeMatram composed by BankimchandraChatterji, was a source of inspiration to the people in their struggle for freedom. It has equal status with Jana-gana-mana. The first political occasion when it was sung was the 1896 session of the Indian National Congress. The following is text of its first stanza:

VandeMataram! Sujalam, suphalam, malayajamshitalam, Shasyashyamalam, Mataram!

Shubhrajyothsnapulakitayaminim, Phullakusumitadrumadalashobhinim,

Suhasinimsumadhurabhashinim, Sukhadamvaradam, Mataram!

English translation of the stanza rendered by Sri Aurobindo in prose is:

I bow to thee, Mother,

Richly-watered, richly-fruited,

Cool with the winds of the south, Dark with the crops of harvests,

The Mother!

Her nights rejoicing in the glory of the moonlight,
Her lands clothed beautifully with her trees in flowering bloom,
Sweet of laughter, sweet of speech,

The Mother, giver of boons, giver of bliss.

National Animal:

The magnificent tiger Pantheratigris (Linnaeus), the national animal of India, is a rich coloured well-stripped animal with a short coat. The combination of grace, strength, ability and enormous power has earned the tiger great respect and high esteem. Out of eight races of the species known, the Indian race, the Royal Bengal Tiger, is found throughout the country except the north-western region and also in the neighbouring countries, Nepal, Bhutan and Bangladesh. The tiger occupies a variety of habitats from dry open jungles, humid ever-green forests to mangrove swamps.

To check the dwindling population of tigers in India, which came down to just 1,827 in 1972, a massive conservation programme was initiated in April 1973, known as the 'Project Tiger'. This project aims to maintain a viable population of tigers in India for scientific, economic, aesthetic, cultural and ecological values. Since then, the tiger population has shown a gradual increase and the census of 1993 puts the tiger population of the country at 3,750. So far, 23 tiger reserves have been established in the country under project, covering an area of 33,046 sq. kms.

National Bird:

The Indian peacock PavoCristatus (Linnaeus) is a colourful, swan-sized bird with a fan-shaped crest of feathers on its head, a white patch under the eye and a long-slender neck. The male of the species is more colourful than the female with glistening blue breast and neck and a spectacular bronze-green train of around 200 elongated feathers. The Female is brownish, slightly smaller than male and it lacks the train. The elaborated courtship of dance of the male by fanning out the tail and quivering the feathers is a gorgeous sight.

The peacock is widely found in the Indian sub-continent from the south and east of the Indus River, Jammu and Kashmir, east to Assam, south to Mizoram and the whole Indian peninsula. The peacock enjoys full protection from people as it is never molested on religious and sentimental grounds. It is fully protected under the Indian Wildlife (Protection) Act1972.

GENERAL RULES

1. Admission

- a) Pupils cannot be admitted without a leaving certificate from the last school attended.
- b) Original birth certificate and Aadhar Card copy are required for Nursery admission.
- Leaving certificate and Aadhar Card copy are required for Junior KG and Senior KG admission.
- d) Information regarding admission for the new academic year will be displayed on our website www.sngcentralschool.org

2. Withdrawal

- a) Application for withdrawal should be submitted only by parents or guardians in the school office.
- b) Leaving certificate will be issued free of charge.
- c) No duplicate copy of Leaving Certificate will be issued.
- d) No Leaving Certificate will be granted unless the school fees are paid in full.
- e) Leaving certificate will be issued after 15 days from the date of application.

3. Leave Of Absence

- a) Attendance on the re-opening day and the last working day of each vacation (Summer/Diwali/Winter) will be condoned only once in a year. Prior permission for the same will have to be taken.
- b) Leave of absence (1 or 2 days) can be granted by the Class Teacher.
- c) Leave of absence (3 or more days) can be granted by the Principal alone. (Please refer the Leave of Absence from School Request Form attached)
- d) No student shall be absent from the school without a valid reason.
- e) If absent for any reason, a note of absence must be given in the calendar by the parent or the guardian.
- f) Parents must obtain permission from the Principal, before taking long leaves.
- g) Absence without leave is liable for penalty either with a fine or any other form at the Principal's discretion.
- h) In case of continued absence due to sickness the school must be informed within 3 days and a medical certificate and a fitness certificate from a registered medical practitioner have to be sent along with a covering letter, the day the pupil reports back to school.
- i) A pupil returning to school after a contagious disease should produce a medical certificate to get the permission to sit in the class.
- j) The responsibility of completing the portion done in the school during any period of absence will be with the parents.

4. Rules Of General Discipline

- a) On school days as well as on functions students must wear the school uniform.
- b) There is an availability of Navy Blue winter wear with our school logo at our uniform vendor. Parents are requested to purchase the same. Students will be asked to return home if not in proper uniform.
- c) Pupils are responsible to the School Authorities for their conduct both in and outside the school. Hence, misbehaviour in public or streets or in conveyances may invite disciplinary action
- d) Running, playing or shouting inside the school building, classroom and transport are not allowed.
- e) Any kind of damage done to school property will have to be made good for.

- f) Students are expected to co-operate with their Captains, Leaders, Monitors and other school official whom they elect to maintain discipline and the ideals of the school.
- g) During the absence of the teacher, monitor will be responsible for order and discipline in the class.
- h) When students move along the corridors they must walk in silence and in single line. They should keep to the left.
- i) Personal Cleanliness and hygiene are expected from all.
- j) Shabby, unkempt hair will not be permitted.
- k) The school should not be littered. Students must use bins provided.
- l) No books (other than text or library books) comics, newspapers or periodicals may be brought to the school premises without the Principal's approval.
- m) No electronic gadgets are allowed in the school.
- n) All students must speak English in the school, even in their private conversation for improving their speaking skill.
- o) Each and every student must work to maintain high standard of the school by excelling in good manners and academics.
- p) Standard V onwards, students are allowed to wear analogue wrist watches only. Fancy and digital watches are not allowed.
- q) Pupils must follow the school regulations regarding punctuality.
- r) Pupils are expected to show courtesy and respect to all. They are expected to stand properly while speaking to the teachers and the Principal.
- s) They are expected to greet members of the staff and visitors to the school.
- t) Pupils must greet the teacher when he/she enters the classroom.
- u) Pupils who do not bring books or the required materials to the school may invite disciplinary action.
- v) Books and other belongings must be labelled with the owner's name.
- w) Pupils must not spoil the walls with ink or chalk or carve names on benches and walls
- x) Class socials must be organised with the Principal's approval.
- y) No pupil should carry large amount as pocket money.
- z) No pupil shall leave the school premises during the working hours without the Principal's permission.
- aa) Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, disobedience or conduct obstructing the smooth working of the school will invite strict actions.
- bb) Any serious breach of discipline or discourtesy to the members of the staff will be dealt with severity.
- cc) Jewellery or valuable articles are not allowed. The school will not be responsible for any loss. Pupils must look after their own belongings.
- dd) Pupil should greet the teachers of the school, whenever they meet them.
- ee) Correct/Proper school uniforms for the boys and girls are mandatory.
- ff) All the students must wear Black Velcro leather shoes and two black striped off-white socks. During monsoon, black rainy shoes will be allowed.
- gg) On school days, open houses, functions, picnics, and excursions, pupils shall wear prescribed school uniforms and the identity card.
- hh) On the P.T/ Mass drill days, students must wear the prescribed P.T uniform with white canvas shoes and white socks.'
- ii) Black hair bands must be used by girls to keep their hair neat and tidy. Boys should have their hair cut one inch above their ears. No fashionable haircuts are permitted.
- jj) Nails of the pupils will be checked every Monday. Dyeing, colouring of hair, applying mehendi on hands, nail paint, nail art or tattoo is strictly prohibited. For mehendi, the pupil can take prior permission for applying, for any religious festival.
- kk) Pupils are strictly not permitted to wear nose rings, dangling earrings, bangles and anklets to the school.
- ll) Parents must ensure that they send all the school books, tiffin's, water bottles, ID cards or any other items that the child may require with the child only. The school will not entertain

- any requests from the parents for sending tiffin's, water bottles or any other items once the child is in the school premises.
- mm) Pupils are not expected to take part in any political activity.
- nn) All letters must be addressed to the principal only.
- oo) Birthday celebrations:
 - a. On birthdays, students are allowed to wear modest coloured clothes.
 - b. A maximum of two toffees or stationery items may be distributed, not exceeding ₹ 5/- per teacher and student. No other gifts will be entertained.
 - c. Pupil can donate one book to the school library, with details like photograph, name and class at the last page of the book. The book should be as per their age and grade. Your small contribution can bring light and brightness of knowledge in everyone's life.
- pp) Any money sent to the school must be enclosed in an envelope mentioning the name, grade and roll number of the pupil.
- qq) In case of loss or theft of the school calendar & Identity card, pupil must pay Rs.50 each to the school office and issue a new one at the earliest.
- rr) Bullying is strictly prohibited inside the school premises and no such act will go unnoticed or unpunished.

5. Notes to Parents:

Parents should carry out their responsibilities as educator in instilling in their children respect and strict obedience for all school rules and regulations.

- a) Students should always wear their School ID card.
- b) Parents are requested to go through their wards school diary regularly and sign the teacher's remarks, if any.
- c) PTA meetings should be regularly attended to discuss the performance and progress of the child.
- d) Parents must check that the child carries books/not books according to time table,
- e) Children should do their homework by themselves unless they require some guidance.
- f) For the best result parents must motivate and support their child establish a proper study area. Home work must be given a priority in the daily schedule.
- g) In case home work has not been completed by the due date then it should be communicated clearly to the class teacher with reason that why the work was not done.
- h) Encourage your ward to read good books or play games, instead of viewing TV.
- i) Parents are requested not to accompany their wards to the class rooms at arrival time. At dispersal time they should collect their wards from the school gate.
- j) Parents are not permitted to meet teachers during school hours. In special cases, parents may be allowed to meet the teacher with prior permission from the Principal.
- k) Parents should ensure that their wards do not bring any objectionable books, magazine, picture or any other material that may violate the disciplinary norms of the school. Otherwise the same will be destroyed in the presence of the student.
- 1) Parents are also requested to ensure that their wards do not bring gift except to offer for distribution on birthdays
- m) Parents are requested to refrain from sending lunch boxes/ notebook of their wards during school hours.
- n) Parents are requested to send their ward in neat and clean uniform. Students should not wear faded, over-size or small-size uniform.
- o) Parents are requested to inform the school if there is any change in address/Tel. numbers.
- p) Please do not give mobile phone to your child. If student is found carrying a mobile phone, it will be confiscated and a heavy fine will be imposed.
- q) Regularly Visit our school website for latest updates. sngcentralschool.org
- r) Encourage your ward o take a balanced interest in studies, co-curricular activities and sports
- s) Criticism of a teacher of the school in presence of a child must be scrupulously avoided as it causes students to loose respect for their teacher with the consequent failure to learn from her, thus retarding the child's progress.

- t) Refrain from giving regular pocket money to your ward. Encourage healthy breakfast and give home cooked food in your wards tiffin and regulate their sleeping hours to at least 8 hours a day
- u) Parents should acknowledge the circular sent from school in the column provided in the Almanac.
- v) Parents should use the "Leave Record" form in the diary when applying for leave or explaining the absence of their children.
- w) Kindly bring your ward's calendar for the orientation programme.
- x) Co-operate with the school in maintaining discipline and order.
- y) Ensure active participation of your ward in all co curricular and extra curricular activities.
- z) Kindly maintain the decorum of the school by coming dressed in formal attire and by being calm and polite while interacting with the school staff.

6. Promotion

- a) Pupils those who will remain absent for any exam shall not be re-examined.
- b) Absence during examination without any valid reason and prior information will be considered as having failed.
- c) In case of illness, medical certificate should be produced.
- d) A student should have attended all the assessment.
- e) In case of absence with prior permission or illness during examination of a particular subject then the average would be considered.
- f) Wilful breach of any of the regulations (passing chits, copying, carrying notes, using gestures) during the conduct of examination is punishable with expulsion from the examination room.
- g) Promotions will be according to the rules prescribed by the secondary board of education from time to time.
- h) No online exam will be conducted.

7. Removal

a) Irregular attendance, repeated absence, resorting to unfair means in examination, habitual idleness, disobedience, objectionable moral influence, destroying school property will justify removal from the institution.

8. Transport Service

- a) Transport will be provided to the students of the school from nursery to std. X on routes declared by the management.
- b) The bus fee will be charged for 12 months of the year.
- c) No responsibility of any sort will be taken if a child is not at the stop on the scheduled time.
- d) If the bus fails to come due to some unforeseen reasons, the parents should arrange for conveyance and there will be no reduction in fee.
- e) Complaint about bus services should be made to the bus contractor through the principal.
- f) The complaint should be entered in the bus complaint book kept in the school.

9. Private Tuitions

- a) The school authorities do not approve of the practice of engaging students with private tutors. However, if a student is very weak in a subject or more than one subject, the permission for the tuition should be sort from the head of the institution.
- b) If any parent or guardian, engages any tutors (from the school staff or any outsider) without the permission of the school authorities will be taken as a serious breach of discipline.

10. Co-curricular Activities

- a) Provision is made for training in art, craft, painting, music, yoga, mass drill, physical training, dance and karate.
- b) Training for public speaking is provided through activities like English / Hindi recitation, Story telling, Presentations and Elocution.
- c) Prizes are awarded annually to the best individual performers.

11. Meet the Principal

a) Parents can meet the Principal between 9:00 am to 11:00 am on all working days or by prior appointment.

12. Meet the Class Teacher

a) Primary and Secondary Section: 11:15 am – 11:30 am [Only on 2nd Saturday]

13. Period of Recovery




